There was great anticipation as we settled into 2022. The prior two years had been pretty challenging, and we were certainly looking for the rainbow after the storm.

SVWC started the year by developing a new strategic plan for our community. A strategic plan serves as a road map around which operating and programming decisions are made. A strategic planning retreat was held that included residents, staff, and trustees from both the Corporate and Foundation boards. Strategic initiatives were developed around six pillars (or priorities) that included governance, financial strength, organizational growth, consumer focus, technology, and workforce. The plan is updated quarterly and reviewed by both boards.

After years of careful planning and study, the Villa expansion project was finally approved by the Corporate Board in March. The project was divided into two phases with five villas to be constructed in each phase. Work began on the site in July of 2022 and SVWC hopes to welcome its first villa residents to the community starting in October 2023.

In May, SVWC celebrated two special occasions on the same day. The first was the “official” groundbreaking for our Villas and the second was SVWC’s 35th anniversary. It was a wonderful afternoon spent with residents, staff, board members, and friends of SVWC. The food, music, and fellowship were simply unsurpassed!

SVWC enhanced its clinical offerings in 2022 by expanding our Therapy Department and for the first time, aquatics therapy was offered as part of our programming. Dr. Paige Patterson was welcomed as SVWC’s first full-time physician in August along with Karen Shank, Geriatric Nurse Practitioner.

For the first time in over two years, SVWC was able to welcome a music therapy intern student. As part of this unique arrangement, the student lives on campus during their six-month internship. This opportunity gives the intern a valuable and powerful perspective on what it is like to work and live in a senior living setting.

As the year progressed, residents saw the return of some of their favorite events such as Happy Hour, Bistro Concerts, Thursday Night Programs, garden socials, Active Aging Week, Veteran’s Day program, gallery exhibits, and Fall Fun Day, to name a few.

In the fall, our Dining Services Department welcomed Rosie as the newest member of their team. Rosie is a robot that helps deliver meals in the Bistro dining room. Blue Ridge Hall welcomed Milo, a 10-month-old golden retriever, as one of the newest members of the SVWC therapy staff. Milo is a Dementia and Alzheimer Focused Therapeutic Service Dog.

Uncertain market conditions, workforce issues, and slightly lower-than-budgeted occupancy rates lead to a negative operating margin for the year, however, all debt covenant ratios were met. SVWC ended the year with a strong balance sheet.

I would like to thank all residents, employees, family members, the Board of Trustees, and business partners for their unwavering dedication during the year. We have successfully weathered the storms and the rainbow is shining brightly over this community.

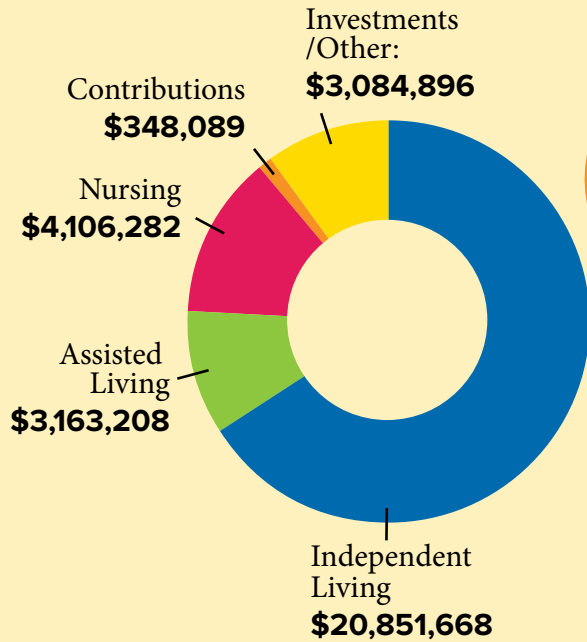

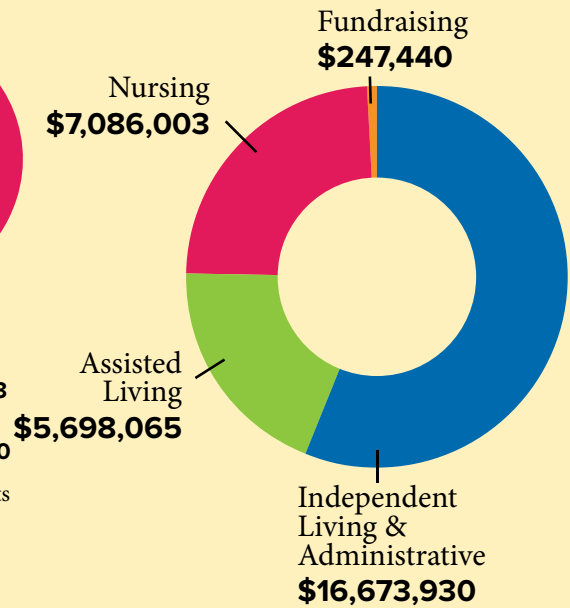
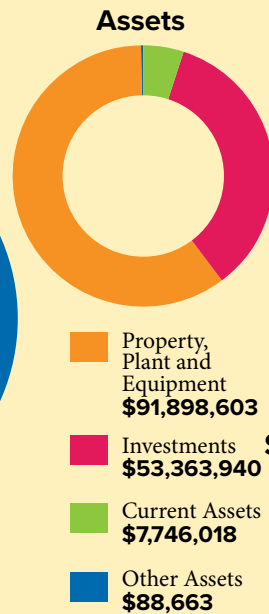

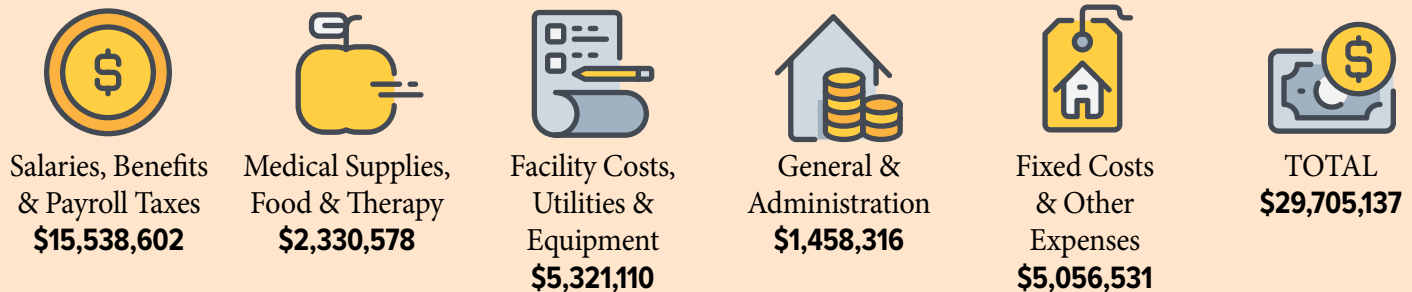
Revenue by Service Area
