#### MISSION

The mission of Parents and Friends of Children and Adults, Inc. DBA Home for Healing (formerly the Family Home of Little Rock) offers support to parents of NICU babies and individuals and their caregivers undergoing cancer treatment by providing convenient and affordable lodging in a peaceful and restorative environment. We house adult and teenage cancer patients, parents of infants in the neonatal intensive care unit, and family members with a loved one in the ICU.

### WHO CAN STAY

Cancer patients receiving out-patient treatment, family members with a loved one in ICU and Neo-natal parents that have a baby in the intensive care unit. We service patients of UAMS, ACH, CARTI, CHI St Vincent, Baptist-Health, Arkansas Surgical Center, Arkansas Urology, and any other medical facility with a need. ALL GUESTS MUST BE REFERRED BY THE SOCIAL WORKERS.

### FUNDING

We are entirely dependent on donations and our fundraisers - The Golf Classic in the spring and Monster Bash in the fall.

### **STATISTICS**

Since we opened in 2003, we have lodged over 8,800 Cancer patients, their caregivers, family members with a loved one in ICU and parents of babies in the NICU. We have had almost 800 babies born to these parents including more than 63 sets of twins and 9 sets of triplets.

Home for Healing has had patients from over 37 states and 7 foreign countries, including Bangladesh, Nepal, Trinidad, Uzbekistan and Zimbabwe.

- **2020:** 54% from Arkansas, 46% from other states 103 families for over 1,647 room nights, saving them over \$228,000. Reduced due to COVID restrictions.
- **2021:** 57% from Arkansas, 43% from other states 144 families for over 2,102 room nights, saving them over \$219,000. We continued to be on reduced number of rooms available due to COVID restrictions.
- **2022:** 79% from Arkansas, 21% from other states/countries 202 families for over 2,398 nights, saving them over \$261,382.

The Cancer Support Center housed in the Home for Healing hosts support groups, activities and entertainment for patients in the house and cancer patients in the metropolitan area. The Serenity Garden, just off the Cancer Support Center, is a haven for patients and caregivers to enjoy the healing powers of nature.
