In 2019 United Methodist Women (UMW) celebrated its 150th anniversary in the month of March. March 2022 brings the birthday of our new name: United Women in Faith. Over the years, the name of the organization has changed its name at least 25 times. When I was reading some of our very old documents for our group, one of the first names I came across was the Women's Foreign Service Missionary Society. The last name that I remember before UMW was the Women's Society of Christian Service which was changed with additional denominations becoming a part of the United Methodist Church. The current name change was prayerfully and thoughtfully considered over the past several years.

"The vision of the organization remains: Turning faith, hope and love into action for women, children and youth around the world." p.4 response March/April 2022 You will see a new website at http:/www.uwfaith.org. Even in times of change we still have the need to connect, work, communicate, enjoy worship and each other. These activities will continue but maybe in new ways. We have learned over the past two years to do things differently and some will remain and some will return to pre-pandemic ways. The new mission statement is as follows: *United Women in Faith seeks to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship, and education so that they can inspire, influence and impact local and global communities*. p. 34 response March/April 2022.

As part of the name change, a new logo has been created which "represents the past, present and future." The symbol refers to our Christian roots with yellow, green, orange and blue parallelograms arranged to form a clear cross. This represents the diversity that we wish to attain along with the inward and outward reflection that we as women of faith engage in.

We will continue to have General and Circles meetings along with our mission projects. Let's all embrace the new United Women in Faith, its logo and new programs.

FELLOWSHIP AND SERVICE WORKDAY – UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH (UMW)

On Tuesday, March 8th, twenty women worked together on a variety of service projects. For the **UMC Midwest Mission Distribution Center** we prepared 50 Birthing Kits and 32 Book Bags. Lenten cards were addressed to 29 homebound members and a box of cards were sent to **St. Jude's Ranch for Children.** For refugee blankets, someone knitted and turned in 41 squares. We cut 42 capes for **kids Capes of Courage.** Over 2 laundry baskets of plastic eggs were filled for the **COTS Easter Egg Hunt.**

Thank you to each of you who helped prepare for the day and especially to those who participated. We cannot number the ways it felt to have fellowship together.

TREASURER'S REPORT

By the time you read this, it will be SPRING!!! We've been through a tough winter with two major snow events and still living with Covid.

But, COTS-UMW continues to be active in learning about ways to help groups and individuals who care for children and women in the U.S. and throughout the world.

Our unit's operating balance at the end of February was \$6,701.40. Pledge donations for February totaled \$260.00. Expenses were \$483.54: (\$152.71 for postage to send the UMW newsletter to women who do not have e-mail; \$115.03 for printing - mainly newsletters; \$50 for February's program; and \$215.80 for receiving blankets associated with the March program).

Coming up in April will be the national UMW's Prayer and Self Denial collection, which, this year, will support the Order of Deaconesses and Home Missioners.

In May there will be a Flea Market designed to sell "hard" goods, not clothing. Proceeds from the sale will be used to support organizations that help women and children in a variety of ways. (See more elsewhere in this newsletter.)

If you are not able to participate in UMW activities (a good way to keep in touch with other church members), your donations are always welcome and will be used for UMW missions.

Wesley Community and Health Centers located in Phoenix began in 1950 and has expanded to three locations. One of the health centers is located next to low-income housing.

The health centers offer family medicine, screenings for breast and cervical cancer, prenatal care, vaccinations and management of chronic diseases. Community centers offer nutrition, community garden experiences, exercise classes plus a healthy box lunch, English as a Second Language classes as well as after school programs. During the pandemic, the Centers helped school children needing computer access.

The health clinics have a patient navigator who guides persons to needed services at an affordable cost. They have connections with institutions such as the Mayo Clinic and Arizona State University. They are grateful for support from United Methodist Women.


