Winners of 2023 Gold & Silver Telly Awards for their Worldwide Choir of Return to Me and Angels in the Garden, composer Emil Adler, writer Julie Flanders and vocalist Marina Belica of October Project are award-winning, genredefying recording artists, producers and content providers who collaborate in the creation of musical recordings and events.

Powered by Flanders' words, Adler's music, and the group's trademark harmonies, their earlier work with SONY/Epic and subsequent recordings have been enjoyed by millions. Bridging the worlds of pop, classical, a cappella and choral, they continue to innovate the landscape of Independent Music.

"Lost," the latest from the group's upcoming album, The Ghost of Childhood, is a mindexpanding marriage of music, spoken word and visuals featuring images from the James Webb Telescope. "Lost" follows the group's interest in creating music that can have a transformative effect, also explored in their Book of Rounds (2016, 2021), a song cycle centered on a new brand of 'conscious rounds' conceived of by Flanders & Adler.

The Book of Rounds features positive messages set over the repetitive, cyclical song structure of a musical round, like modern mantras. The Book of Rounds: Choral Edition, recorded with Chorus Austin, (Ryan Heller, Artistic Director), was on

the Grammy Ballot for Best Choral Performance in 2021.

Silver Telly Winner Angels in the Garden features the sand art of Ukrainian artist Kseniya Simonova, and served as a fundraiser for the IRC in Ukraine, Angels for Ukraine. The short film is a 2023 selection at the prestigious Women Deliver conference in Rwanda with Malala keynoting.

Gold Telly winner the Worldwide Choir of Return To Me, featuring 130 performers from 18 countries, was produced by Emil Adler, conducted by Ryan Heller, Artistic Director of Chorus Austin, with vocal arrangements by Keiji Ishiguri and visual direction by Ulrich Vilbois, the same creative team that won a Bronze Telly and Anthem Award for their work together on the Virtual Choir of Joy in 2021.

Flanders' Genesis Prize-winning piece, Holding our Breath, written with Venezuelan composer Carlos Cordero opened 2023 with performances at the Kennedy Center & Carnegie Hall. The duo also debuted a commission this year for Dominick DiOrio and the Philadelphia Mendelssohn Chorus, one of America's longest standing and esteemed ensembles.

Following upon the success of "Doubts", an award-winning short film of a Flanders poem that achieved official selection at 30 film festivals, their newest poem-turned-visual experience, "The Big Sadness" (written/narrated by Flanders, directed by Samuel Flanders), launched under the October Project Studios arm and surged to 250,000+ views in its debut month on YouTube.

The band will continue to release singles from The Ghost of Childhood throughout 2023.







