Letter from the CEO and Board Chair

Go Beyond.

Five million children in the United States alone are impacted by a parent’s or guardian’s cancer. That’s 1 child in 15 – about one child in each classroom across the country.

Many of these children have taken on the role of a caregiver, tending to a sick parent and attending doctor appointments. They are often also helping to raise younger siblings and running errands. This means that these youth caregivers are missing out on their childhood – a time that should be filled with fun, exploration, and adventure.

This came to light at camp this summer, when one of our teens firmly insisted on participating in activities with the younger children, instead of joining the teen programming. Why? She didn’t get to do “kid things” when she was younger, because she had to care for her sick parent. Before this camper graduated high school and went off to do “big things as an adult,” she wanted a little more time to still be a kid. We were happy to oblige.

More than ever, kids need Kesem. In 2023, we took significant steps to come closer to supporting every child impacted by a parent’s cancer. We completed several months of research rooted in diversity, equity and inclusion. This research included ethnographic research, quantitative surveys, and focus groups of families not currently served by Kesem.

What did we learn and what are we doing about it?

We learned that families want us to “meet them where they are,” with more frequent opportunities to connect in person and virtually. As a result, we created three new programs, one virtual and two in-person. These new programs are generally monthly, and although they won’t be focused on camp, they will still have the same Kesem feel and magic.

We also learned that families seek increased psychosocial support to help children navigate isolation and challenging times. To address this, we’re increasing awareness of our existing mental health and grief support service, Kesem by Your Side. We’re also providing more resources for families, directly through Kesem and through our community partners.

Starting in 2024, the breadth and depth of our support goes well beyond Camp Kesem. We are striving to serve more of the five million children impacted by a parent’s cancer. It’s an exciting time here at Kesem, and we cannot provide these critical, transformative programs without you. Thank you for being a part of our community and for generously supporting our mission.

Kesem’s approach is to support children through CARE and fun.

CONTINUOUS LEARNING - We help children understand how to process their parent’s cancer journey by modeling coping mechanisms and providing ways to share their experiences.

ACCOUNTABILITY - We help children be responsible for how they choose to respond to a parent’s cancer journey.

RESILIENCE - We help children emotionally navigate their most difficult days, knowing there will be better days ahead.

EMPATHY - We allow children to heal by connecting them with other children navigating the same situation.

FUN! - We know that there are measurable links between fun and mental health, and that people who laugh together create deeper personal connections.

The Kesem Journey

Kesem is unique in that children can return year after year from elementary, through middle school, and until they graduate from high school, all at no cost to families. Each year that a child attends our programs, kids’ connection with Kesem, each other, and their families deepens.

Our volunteer base is college students from over 120 chapters across the country. Once the children we serve turn 18 and finish high school, those who attend a college or university often select one where they can continue their Kesem journey as a leader and volunteer. After college graduation, many of our volunteers continue to serve Kesem for years as alumni.

As a result, Kesem is truly a lifetime of support.

Kesem is for Families

In September 2020, our lives were forever altered when my husband Rob was diagnosed with glioblastoma multiforme (GBM), a fast-growing, aggressive brain tumor. Just eight weeks later, we faced the unimaginable reality of his passing. In the midst of our profound grief, Kesem entered our lives as a beacon of light.

The pandemic added complexities to our cancer journey, but it also allowed us to cherish moments as a family in the months leading up to Rob's diagnosis. Despite the heartbreak, his mantra remained, "life is good." Rob's love for our children was boundless, and it became his wish that they experience the magic of Kesem. Kesem became a lifeline for us, offering invaluable support for our four children who were grappling with grief in the wake of their father's terminal illness.

Rob's legacy inspired the creation of the Four Lions Foundation, an organization that honors his life. Rob's favorite pastime - golf - became the foundation's conduit for a yearly tournament. This event is more than a gathering; it's an opportunity to give back. Knowing the toll a cancer diagnosis takes on a child's mental health and a family's finances, Kesem became the chosen beneficiary for the tournament.

Kesem has been a transformative force in our lives, offering my children a sanctuary where they can be authentically themselves. As many of you probably know, it's a place of belonging, fostering bonds with counselors and peers that extend beyond the campfire. For them, Kesem is a support system that bridges the gap of loneliness and isolation that often accompanies a parent's cancer diagnosis.



To me, #GoBeyond with Kesem means giving back when and HOW you can. I've seen Kesem reshape my children's lives, providing them with a sense of belonging and purpose on their grief journey.

Our college student volunteer training builds on the inherent leadership qualities of every student volunteer to further cultivate the core skills and competencies essential to deliver transformative experiences for the children and families we serve today and to lead in the future.

Investing in a New Future

We recognize that every family's experience with parental cancer is different, and different types of support are needed to meet families where they are. In this moment, we are focused on continuing to drive enduring positive outcomes through free offerings including our signature program, Camp Kesem, and legacy services while bringing about new and innovative programs that meet the unique and changing needs of this community.

Our Flagship Program

Camp Kesem, a week-long sleepaway summer camp, is hosted by Kesem chapters across the country. Our student leader volunteers and professional staff, deliver a fun, empowering and safe experience for children and adolescents facing a parent's cancer to escape and rediscover the joy of their youth.

New Virtual and In-Person Programs Nationwide

In the summer of 2023, we launched the pilot of **Club Kesem**. This program is an age-based national virtual meet up for children and youth ages 6-18 impacted by a parent's cancer to build connections, relationships, and have fun with kids their age who are going through similar experiences. The program became available to all families in the U.S. in January 2024.

We are also offering two pilot in-person programs, **Kesem Better Days** and **Kesem Gatherings** in 13 markets. The full-day Better Days programming allows Kesem kids and volunteers to have more extended time together year-round, while our monthly Gatherings allows Kesem kids and volunteers to get together more regularly to build relationships and have fun.


Year-Round Services

Provides customized, personal support needed during a parent's cancer journey, including difficult news, recurrence, loss, and anniversaries.

We anticipate supporting over 500 Kesem by Your Side requests in 2024.

Friends + Family Days

Generally twice a year, brings together existing and interested families, Kesem student leaders and alumni, and local supporters for a day of activities, fun, celebration, and community building.

We'll have over 8,500 participants at our 2024 Friends + Family Days.

Special Deliveries

Provides children with personalized greetings such as birthday cards, delivered either by traditional or electronic mail to remind all Kesem families that they are a part of our community.

We'll send over 8,000 Special Deliveries in 2024.

Warm Welcome

Provides every child a friendly welcome to Kesem to immediately bring them and their families into our greater community in a personal and supportive way.

We'll send over 8,000 Warm Welcomes in 2024.


