This list is constantly updated and will eventually cover over 35 different makes. Acura, Honda, Audi, VW: Check the driver side door panel, pillar, or spare tire well for the trim code sticker. Alternatively, VW may have it under the rear bench seat. BMW: The VIN can be found at the left front dash area (seen through the windshield) or on the driver's side door pillar. A leather color description is always helpful. GM/Chevrolet/Pontiac/Buick/Cadillac/Hummers: Look for the Service Parts Identification sticker in the glove box, driver side door pillar, or spare tire well. The interior color code is at the bottom right of the sticker, ending with "I" (e.g., "RPO code I"). Chrysler/Dodge/Fiat/Jeep: Check the VIN sticker on the driver's side door or pillar for the trim code labeled "TRM:". Ford/Lincoln/Mercury: Find the interior trim code on the VIN sticker at the driver's side door or pillar. GMC/Honda/Infiniti/Isuzu: Refer to the Service Parts Identification sticker in the glove box, driver side door pillar, or spare tire well for the interior color code. Jaguar often leaves an interior trim sticker on the hood underside or driver's side door pillar. Jeep typically has the TRM: title code on the VIN sticker attached to the driver's side door or door pillar. Kia usually keeps the interior trim code on the driver's side door pillar, while Land Rover encodes it in the VIN. Lexus and Toyota vehicles normally have the trim code sticker on either the driver side door or door pillar. Lincoln stores its interior trim code on the VIN sticker attached to the driver's side door or door pillar. Mazda keeps the VIN sticker with paint and interior trim codes in the driver's side door jamb. Before searching for option codes, Mercedes usually associates interior options with the VIN, making it sufficient to use the vin alone. If finding the leather option code is necessary, look for a stamped tag under the hood attached to the radiator support or a sticker on the driver's side door jamb, or inside the spare tire wheel well (leather options start with "2"). Lincoln vehicles keep their interior trim codes on the VIN sticker attached to the driver's side door or door pillar. Mini follows BMW's convention, requiring only the VIN to determine the interior color code. The VIN sticker is usually affixed to the driver's side door jamb. Mitsubishi has its interior color code on the VIN sticker attached to the driver's side door jamb, with SUVs sometimes having a metal tag riveted to the firewall. Nissan vehicles include their interior color codes on the VIN sticker attached to the driver's side door jamb. Porsche is inconsistent with its option code stickers; look for it on the owner's manual first page, then check the spare tire well and under the hood (if necessary). Subaru keeps its trim codes on the VIN sticker attached to the door jamb or a smaller sticker below it. Volkswagen, like Audi, has an option code sticker usually found in the spare tire well of the trunk. Most vehicles tie their interior trim codes to the VIN number, but having the color suggestion is still helpful.
