


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When utilizing the AMA citation style for PowerPoint presentations, in-text citations are denoted by a superscript numeral correlating to a reference on the AMA reference list. While it's not mandatory, you may include the author's name within your narrative.



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Some general rules

- · All references are made at the end of the paper.
- · References are listed in the order they appear in the text.
- When citing the same source more than once, reuse the original endnote number but include the specific page you are making reference to. For example,

Atwater[®] reported that the alcohol consumption of college students decreased in their senior year which supported Abbott's and Orsbom's[®] earlier findings.

- For articles, capitalize only the first letter of the first word, proper names and abbreviations that always appear in caps.
- For other titles, capitalize the first letter of the every word that isn't an
 article, preposition or less than 3 letters.



For instance, in-text citations using the AMA format should be integrated into the sentence that mentions the source, typically positioned at the conclusion of a clause or sentence. If more clarity is needed, place the citation immediately after the author's name or a direct quote. The citation number should directly When compiling a literature review or theoretical framework, it's common to reference multiple sources at a single point in the text. In such cases, you can list several superscript in-text citations together, separated by commas without spaces. For citing a sequence of three or more sources in a row, an en dash (-) is used. For instance, Caspian et al.'s studies^3,5 question the longstanding view of a particular condition being invariably degenerative.^6-8 Page numbers, if included, should be enclosed in parentheses, with the citation numbers and separating commas placed outside. An example of this would be: "Research indicates that 84% of dog owners feel their pets enhance their happiness,"^4(p11),5-7.



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This may also include the specific page number or section of the source you're referencing, such as a quote^2(p46).

When citing multiple sources at once, present them as a list or range without spaces ^3,5-9.
