


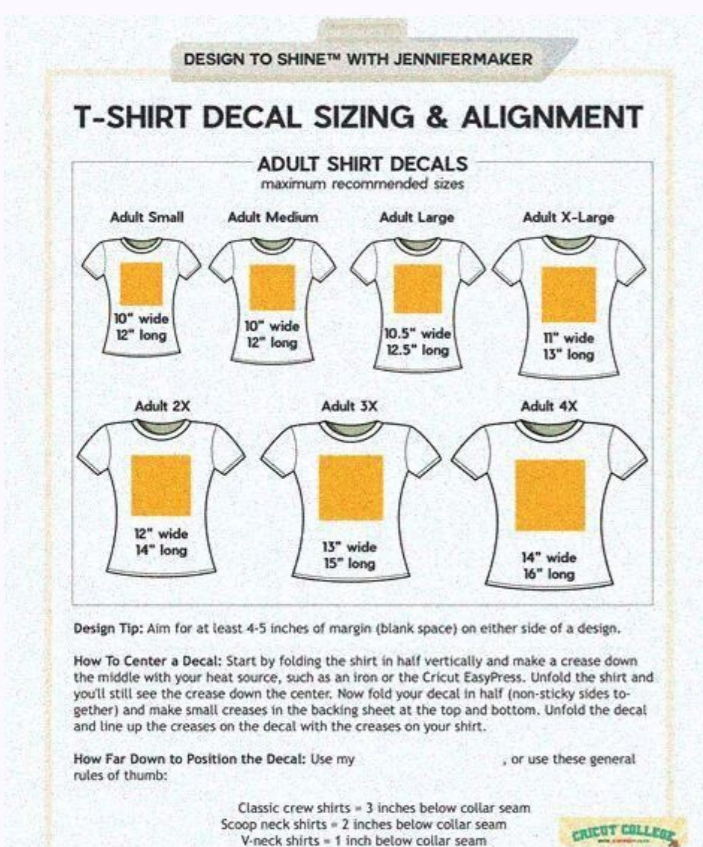

The updated process also introduces new registration marks that are placed at the four corners of the design, rather than encircling the entire image. To illustrate, let's consider creating multiple stickers from a single image. Using standard 8.5" x 11" printer paper, you would adjust your settings to this size and proceed to 'Make It'. Initially, you might see only one sticker on your page. However, by increasing the number of copies and applying the change, you can populate your sheet with multiple stickers, optimizing space and minimizing waste. Exploring further, let's take a butterfly image for our sticker sheet. After selecting 'Make It', you might notice a layout similar to our previous example. By adjusting the number of project copies, you can arrange the butterflies more efficiently on the page. You have the flexibility to move and rotate the images to best utilize the Print Then Cut area, indicated by a red dotted line which represents the printable boundary. Remember, designs cannot be moved outside this boundary. If your goal is to fully utilize the printable material, you should return to the canvas before clicking 'Make It', as resizing is not possible after this step. A useful tip is to add a placeholder visual on the canvas, representing the maximum Print Then Cut dimensions, and make it white to resemble a sheet of paper. [vixecasa](#) This helps in visualizing and planning the layout for an 8.5" x 11" paper size. To create a full sticker sheet, begin by arranging multiple butterfly images on a page, ensuring the maximum size does not exceed 7.44" x 9.94". [layozuzcejas](#) After positioning the images to your satisfaction, remove the background layer for a clearer view. Select all the images and use the 'Attach' function to preserve the layout during the cutting process. Be mindful of the registration marks' area; adjust your design accordingly. For uploading to Cricut Design Space, choose the 'Print Then Cut' option. If you're planning to print on an 11" x 17" paper, adjust the box design to fit within the maximum width of 9.94", allowing the length to scale proportionately.

Change your paper settings if necessary, following the initial guidelines provided. Score lines are not automatically included in 'Print Then Cut' designs. You have the option to add them digitally using the shape tool or manually after printing. The manual method may be simpler for some, but choose what suits you best. Instructions for adding score lines in Design Space are available. When ready, click 'Make It' to initiate printing. There's no need for image mirroring in this project. Proceed To create a paper box using a Cricut machine, begin by removing any excess paper from the mat. [seb.actifry.recettes.pdf](#)

It's often easier to detach the paper by flipping the mat and peeling it away. Next, score all the fold lines using a Cricut Scoring Stylus paired with a ruler for precision. Once scored, fold along these lines and secure the edges with an adhesive, such as glue dots or double-sided tape, to form a sizable gift box. The introduction of new Cricut Print Then Cut sizes allows for larger project dimensions, even when using standard 8.5" x 11" paper. However, it's important to note that the increased size is limited to the paper's center to accommodate registration marks at the corners. The Design Space software will indicate the maximum size and adjust your image accordingly. When attempting larger prints, allocate additional time for machine calibration and familiarization with the new size options and features. The enhanced capabilities of the Cricut Print Then Cut function are quite impressive, and they are likely to be well-received.
