Surprisingly, this company's color chart has been adopted in diamond painting kits to categorize the drills (diamonds) by their respective colors, with 447 different DMC numbers available. This system allows artists to organize their leftover drills from various projects by matching the corresponding numbers. For instance, DMC-522 corresponds to an army green, while DMC-310 represents black and DMC-151 is baby pink. We're pleased to offer a free downloadable DMC color chart for your reference. When printing, please use a high-quality laser printer to ensure accurate color swatches. This chart serves as a valuable resource for identifying replacement diamonds if some are missing or lost from your kit. You can also utilize it to purchase new drills. Our diamond painting kits feature multiple AB (Aurora Borealis) drills, which boast an iridescent coating that mimics the shimmering colors of the Northern Lights. These premium diamonds add extra sparkle and shine to finished artworks. Interestingly, the DMC color chart used in diamond painting is the same as the one employed for embroidery thread. At its core, DMC is renowned for its embroidery floss and color chart system. A DMC Color Chart serves as a visual guide that pairs each color with its corresponding number code, along with the name. However, it's essential to note that while the numbers remain consistent across charts, the names can vary. This discrepancy emphasizes the importance of relying on the numerical codes for accuracy. DMC colors are instrumental in diamond painting, allowing artists to match their embroidery floss with the drills they need. By using DMC codes, crafters can locate specific threads or yarns anywhere in the world, making it a universal standard. The system includes 489 numbers on the U.S. DMC website, covering nearly every color imaginable. For diamond painting kits from Diamond Art Club, each symbol is assigned a DMC number, which guides artists in selecting the right color for their canvas. This approach simplifies storage and organization, as beads with the same code will always be of the same color. The decision to use DMC codes stems from practicality; it leverages an existing standardized system rather than creating a proprietary one. This choice appeals particularly to crafters who enjoy multiple projects, such as cross-stitch, and find value in consistency across different crafts. Diamond painting enthusiasts can benefit from using the same codes as embroidery thread or yarn, ensuring consistency across crafts. The DMC numbering system provides a universal language, eliminating the need to learn multiple systems. This universality also makes it easier to source additional diamonds and keep track of spare drills for future projects. However, slight variations may occur due to different dye lots and manufacturing processes. The DMC color chart for diamond painting is similar to that used in embroidery floss, featuring close-up images of extra rhinestones to determine colors. This chart can be downloaded or purchased online or created using personal bead collections. Making a custom DMC color card helps track owned diamonds and prevents mixing or accidental spills. Simply glue a diamond next to its DMC number on paper, adding new drills as they're acquired. The chart also enables cross-referencing with other brands that use different color systems.
