In 1943, there were approximately 3 million men drafted into service. The number decreased gradually over the years until 1950 when it dropped to around 10,000. In 1965, the draft saw an increase of about 230,000, followed by a significant jump in 1966 with nearly 382,000 men being drafted. The numbers continued to rise, peaking at around 300,000 in 1969. In 1970, the lottery system was reintroduced, and on December 1, 1969, a drawing took place to determine the order of call for induction during the calendar year 1970. This event assigned lottery numbers to all men born between January 1, 1944, and December 31, 1950. The lottery continued until 1972 when the last draft call was made on December 7. The authority to induct expired on June 30, 1973. Registration with the Selective Service System was suspended in April 1975, and processing was halted in January 1976. Registration resumed in July 1980 for men born in 1960 and later, and it remains in effect today.
