However, like many other business pre-built PCs, this model may have proprietary elements like the power supply, the chassis or the power connector, which can make it difficult for users to install aftermarket PSUs to support better GPUs. You can also find that there is space constraints inside the chassis, making it difficult to accommodate larger GPU to boost the gaming performance. Please explore the sections below to find ideas and suggestions on how to upgrade Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF. Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF does not meet Windows 11 hardware requirements due to its Intel 7th Gen CPU or older. Upgrading from Windows 10 requires TPM 2.0 and UEFI Secure Boot BIOS. However, users can download the official Windows 11 ISO and install it manually. For GPU upgrade, AMD's Radeon RX 6400 low-profile is a good option for SFF gaming builds due to its low power requirements (75W) that rely solely on the PCIe slot. Other options include GTX 1050 Ti, GTX 1650, and RTX A2000, but keep in mind they may run hot or be noisy. The Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF supports Gen2 Intel Core technology with a maximum of 6 cores (on an i7 processor). Upgrading to more recent CPUs is recommended for enjoying recent games. The system has four RAM slots and supports dual-channel memory configuration, sufficient for most use cases. For office work, home use, and light gaming, 8GB of RAM is recommended, while 16GB or more is needed for heavier workloads. Faster RAM speeds permit faster processor access to stored data. The motherboard supports RAM speeds up to 1333 MT/s. The Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF does not have on-board Wi-Fi support, so users can opt for external USB Wi-Fi adapters or PCIe-based wireless adapters for upgrading the system with Wi-Fi capabilities, but has less space for a decent antenna, and may experience thermal issues. On the other hand, the PCIe-based adapter is more powerful, reliable, and features better antennas, but it's harder to install. If you need enough USB ports, external devices can become problematic. Before buying a system, consider your use case and plan the number of expansion ports accordingly. USB portsThe Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF comes with ten USB ports in total. While having more ports is better, also pay attention to their version. Higher versions support faster transfer speeds. Unfortunately, this model doesn't come with a USB 3.1 port. If you need faster connections for peripherals like external Solid State Drives, choose another model. Video portsThe DisplayPort (DP) is the most widely used digital interface for transmitting digital video and audio between display devices and PCs. The Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF features a DisplayPort 1.2, which is good for most users but not ideal for those who want higher resolutions with high refresh rates. HDMI portThe HDMI port has similar capabilities to the DisplayPort, but this model doesn't have one. This isn't a problem if there's an on-board DisplayPort available. To use video ports, you need a CPU with integrated graphics card. If you have a dedicated GPU, use its ports instead.SSD storage - M.2 sockets and SATA portsThe SATA port is for connecting storage devices. The Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF comes with three SATA ports. However, it has no M.2 PCIe socket, relying on available SATA ports for drives. The M.2 PCIe SSD connector allows for higher transfer rates compared to the old SATA interface. In some situations, an NVMe device connected to the M.2 PCIe socket can be more than 5 times faster.Power SupplyThe Dell OptiPlex 790 SFF comes with a 240 Watt PSU. A high-power supply is essential, especially when upgrading with additional components like dedicated GPUs and HDDs. Power supply unit (PSU) capacity of 240W may be sufficient for your needs depending on how you intend to use it. It's also worth noting that some motherboards offer multiple PSU options, so choose the most powerful one if available, as this could simplify future upgrades and make maintenance more manageable.

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
